I am now 21 years old and study at Birmingham Conservatoire, a special university just for music. I've always loved music and starting learning in Wilmcote Primary School! I begin with playing the piano outside school time, but in Wilmcote we were offered the chance to play a musical instrument in year three. So I decided to learn the violin when I was 7. My teacher was the coolest man I had ever met, Mr Hughes! I can still remember his dog finger puppet, I hope he still uses him. I started the ABRSM grades and when I achieved grade 4, Mr Hughes gave me the idea to try playing the viola.

The viola is similar to a violin, but is slightly bigger and has lower sounding strings. I fell in love with it! So as I got to high school, I started playing my viola more and more, and I continued doing grades all through high school and sixth form. As well as playing other instruments such as the piano, violin and oboe, I knew for some time that I wanted to be a professional musician. The viola is quite a rare instrument and the more I played in groups and orchestras, the more I wanted to play it for my job.

At the end of sixth form in 2012, I achieved grade 8 and decided I wanted to go to music university. Before auditioning in March 2014, I spent two years out of school so I could get work experience before I went to music college. I helped in Warwickshire County Music Service in string orchestras as well as other jobs. The most interesting job I started during my gap years was to teach children the violin and piano myself, and I love it!

In March 2014 I auditioned for two music colleges- one in London and the other Birming-ham Conservatoire. To my surprise, they both said yes! It was the happiest day of my life. I chose Birmingham, and am currently studying there now. I am so glad I started playing music in Wilmcote Primary School because that gave me the idea of becoming a musician

that I am today!
