#### Traffic Infrastructure

### **Cycle Route**

- Plan: Upgrade the towpath from Wilmcote to Stratford for a safe cycle route.
- **Concerns**: Safety issues with cyclists, runners, and dog walkers sharing space next to deep water.
- **Implementation**: Widening the path, upgrading the surface, adding lighting, and surveillance.
- Impact: Removal of hedgerows, destroying wildlife habitat. No other safe route available.
- Challenges: Towpath owned by a third party.
- Alternatives: Learnington and Hatton have more suitable routes.

### **Train Service**

- **Current State**: Wilmcote has limited hourly services to Birmingham and bi-hourly to Leamington Spa.
- **Development Issues**: Costly to upgrade for disabled access, parking, and improved services.
- **Alternatives**: Learnington and Hatton have mainline stations with frequent services, requiring less investment.

### Buses

- **Current Service**: X20 runs along A3400, proposed to be redirected through Wilmcote, increasing traffic.
- Infrastructure Needs: Construction of curb stones and modern digital bus stops, urbanizing the landscape.
- **Environmental Concerns**: Potential use of diesel vehicles; EV charging stations needed if EVs are introduced.

#### Roads

- **Upgrades Needed**: Dualing and upgrading the A46 and A3400, upgrading roundabouts.
- Traffic Impact: Significant increase in traffic, leading to congestion and pollution.
- Challenges: High costs and potential land acquisition.

### **Loss of Green Belt**

- Purpose: The Green Belt prevents urban sprawl, merging of towns, and protects the countryside.
- **Impact**: Proposed development in the Green Belt will destroy wildlife habitats and the natural beauty of Wilmcote.

# **Employment Opportunities**

- Local Jobs: Minimal local employment opportunities.
- **Commuting**: Majority of residents will need to commute, making the settlement environmentally unsustainable.
- Alternatives: Non-Green Belt sites like Leamington, Hatton, or Long Marston.

#### Flood Risk

- Current Risk: Wilmcote identified as high-risk for flooding by Stratford District council
- **Impact of Development**: Increased surface water run-off, pressure on drainage systems, and higher insurance costs. Likely damage to settlements downstream of the run offs.
- Challenges: High costs of upgrading infrastructure

# **Heritage and Conservation Area**

- Impact: Increased traffic and urban sprawl will harm the historic village centers of Wilmcote and Bearley.
- **Cultural Heritage**: Potential damage to Mary Arden's house, a grade I property and site of global interest due to its connection to William Shakespeare

# **Landscape and Habitat Destruction**

- Impact: Loss of tranquil landscapes and wildlife habitats.
- Mental Well-being: Negative effects on residents and visitors due to loss of green spaces.

**Note**: Comments on infrastructure such as health, education, and police services being overwhelmed are common to all proposed new settlement sites and are not included here.
